As stated above, Ann will portray Deborah Sampson, a soldier in the Revolutionary War. Deborah was the descendant of those who sailed the Mayflower, Miles Standish and William Bradford.

Her family settled in Plymouth and suffered the oppression of King George. At the age of ten, Deborah's family was poor and penniless and her mother was forced to sell Deborah and her brothers and sisters into indentured servitude. So at the age of eighteen, when the young woman heard the cry of George Washington, she was prepared to fight and die for her liberty; she dressed as a man and enlisted in the Continental Army.

Civil War Roundtable

The Civil War Roundtable announces the annual Wreath Laying Ceremony honoring the 9th Connecticut Volunteer Infantry Regiment (Irish Volunteers) will be held at Bay View Park in City Point on Sunday, November 12th at 11 AM. The public is invited to attend this free event; a reception will follow at the Gaelic Club on Venice Place, East Haven (across from the Municipal Golf Course on Laurel Street).

Sponsored each year by the Civil War Roundtable, The Irish American Historical Society, Irish History Roundtable and the Ancient Order of Hibernians, this brief ceremony honors those brave Irish colonists from Connecticut who served their country in the Civil War.

Their regular monthly meetings are held at 7:30 PM on the second Monday of the month, the Miller Library in Hamden. At each meeting, a guest speaker discusses various Civil War topics. Their next meeting is scheduled for November 13th.

The Pardee Morris House was burned during the Battle of New Haven when over 3000 British troops invaded New Haven's Eastern and Western Shores.

This Historic Landmark is currently closed to visitors, however, it is located at 325 Lighthouse Rd, near Light House Park in New Haven and the exterior can be viewed. It is part of the New Haven Eastern Shore where Fort Nathan Hale is located.

About Fort Adams

Fort Adams is a National Historic Landmark and an official "Save America Treasures" project. It is owned by the State of Rhode Island and managed by the non-profit Fort Adams Trust. Their mission is to direct and support the stabilization, restoration and maintenance and operation of Fort Adams. For the past six years, Newport Collaborative of Architects has focused its efforts on the preservation and rehabilitation of this historic site. Built between 1824 and 1857, it is one of the largest and most complex fortifications in the United States.

Restoration has been completed on the exterior and interior of the north casements, now totaling 7200 square feet of exhibit and event space. Also completed was the restoration and waterproofing of earthen Ramparts. Terrplein chimneys were repaired and rebuilt. Deteriorated cordon stones were repaired or replaced.

NCA has designed the conversion of four casements into a Youth Overnight Center. They have designed and installed, after collaboration with historians, 14 interpretive panels that tell visitors about Fort Adams history, technology and significant personalities.

The work completed at Fort Adams shows what dedication to historic restoration can accomplish. An inspiring example and we are encouraged as we contemplate what's next with Fort Nathan Hale Restoration Projects Inc.
