Semi Annual Meeting

This year's semi annual meeting will feature a presentation on preserving Fort Adams.

Fort Adams, in Newport Rhode Island, is one of the largest and most complex fortifications in the United States, built between 1824 and 1857. Built to protect Narragansett Bay from seaborne attack, the fort served the nation proudly until 1965 when it was turned over to the State of Rhode Island. While the State Park around the fort has thrived, the historic fortifications fell into disrepair and were in jeopardy of collapse in the 1990s.

The Fort Adams Trust, working with

the Newport Collaborative Architects (NCA), has successfully raised funds for restoration, attracted tens of thousands of visitors each year and completed several one-of-a-kind rehabilitation projects. Come hear how the Trust and NCA have worked together to successfully reinvigorate the Fort and restore its glory.

Arnold N. Robinson, AICP is a Senior Associate with (NCA) and has served as project manager for all work at Fort Adams over the past six years. Mr. Robinson will be speaking on various aspects including fund raising, strategic planning

Our Newest Board Member

The FNHRP is both happy and proud to announce our newest board member, *Nancy V. Ahern.*

She is a direct descendant of John Beach, who came to New Haven from England in 1638. Elm City Parks Conservancy Update

Each year, Elm City Parks Conservancy casts a pewter medallion representing one of New Haven's park statues or monuments.

This year at the request of the mayor, Cordilee Benoit, President of ECPC, has announced that the medallion will be the "Angel of Peace" which adorns the top of the Soldiers and Sailors monument on top of East Rock Park. You may have noticed she was missing, taken down for a much needed restoration and cleaning. The Angel of Peace has now been returned to East Rock Park.

The Soldiers and Sailors monument honors those who served their country with scenes from our major wars from the Revolution to the Civil War in 1861.

The medallions are offered for sale at \$12 each or three for \$30. They can be ordered from Marge Ottenbreit at 466-1596 or from ECPC at 946-5713. The medallions are lovely keepsakes representing the wonderful statues and monuments that grace our city parks.

The Federal Art Project

Don't miss the exhibit of the Federal Art Project at the New Haven Museum and Historical Society on display until September 2007.

During the dark days of the depression, President Franklin Roosevelt created the Federal Art Project to give work to unemployed artists. The artist was given a small salary, but had to raise funds for his own art supplies.

The first project in New Haven was the portrait painted of Mayor John Murphy by Ferdinand Maiorano to be on view at City Hall. However, civic leaders and government officials were not of particular interest to the general public.

They then began theme art, the painting and sculptures of murals and statues of historic figures, prominent in our colonial history, as well as illustrations of children stories and commemorative events. This form of art, had much greater interest because they told a story, easily understood by anyone viewing it.

Some of this beautiful art work has been destroyed over time, but much can still be seen throughout New Haven. Beautifully painted scenes depicting the life of Nathan Hale can be seen on the walls of Nathan Hale School and photos of these murals can be seen at the pavilion at Fort Nathan Hale. Other art includes the Amistad mural at Troop School and the art work in the children's room of the New Haven Public Library, to name just a few.

The museum exhibit, under the direction of Amy Trout, Curator, covers much more information and pictures of art work done during this period of high unemployment after the depression.

There is a modest entry fee which covers the Federal Art Project exhibits well as all the other historic exhibits at the museum.
